## LOOKING TO 2026



If a purpose of history is to understand the present and help us shape the future, this winter's Discover Norwich talk on local experiences during the American Revolution serves the purpose.

The Revolutionary era was a challenging time for Norwich; living on a frontier, combined with a world turned upside down, forced everyone to make hard decisions about political allegiances, policing domestic enemies, keeping their families safe, and maintaining solidarity. By the end of the war, Norwich voters declared that they were free citizens with a desire for tranquility and a principle of humanity. They had been challenged, but came together as a community, affirming the sovereignty of the people living under the rule of law.

The questions they had to tackle resonate with issues we face today and provide opportunity for building discussion, rooted in the past but pointing toward the future.

## ADDITIONS TO THE COLLECTION

## 2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

We celebrated Dan & Whit's 70<sup>th</sup> birthday this year! For 70 years, Dan & Whit's has been a vital part of community life in Norwich. In 1955 Leon Merrill sold his business to Dan Fraser and Whit Hicks. Store expansion in 1963, 1968, and 1972 provided space for over 250,000 items fulfilling the phrase "if we don't have it, you don't need it." The countless small acts of kindness and the impressive "19 Days of Norwich" have endeared this store to all of Norwich. Our 2025 exhibit featured Chad Finer's portraits, taken in 2006, and Kay McCabe's photographs taken this summer which capture what we all feel is the heartbeat of the community. In August we held a birthday party with over 250 people in attendance, all offering the Fraser family much love and congratulations.
